Driving when you are over 70

There are some news reports at present suggesting that there will be changes to how you renew a driving licence once you reach 70 years old.

<u>This may happen but there are no changes to the law yet — just suggestions for the future.</u>

Currently, once you reach 70 you have to renew your driving licence every 3 years by declaring that you meet the eyesight requirement and that you do not have specific medical conditions that could impact your ability to drive safely.

The easiest way to renew your licence is online at www.gov.uk/renew-driving-licence-at-70 or use the paper form that you will be sent.

September Facts and Legends ...

September was named by the Romans after 'septem', as it was the seventh month in the original calendar. The month is associated with Vulcan, the Roman god of fire. The Anglo-Saxons called the month 'Gerst Monath' - barley month, as the crop was harvested at this time of year and a special drink was made from it. It was also known as 'Haefest Monarth' or harvest month.



The September flowers are aster and morning glory'
The birthstone is sapphire.



The full harvest moon in September is known as the Corn Moon

Weather folk lore for September includes:

Heavy September rain brings drought.

Fair on 1 September, fair for the month.

September dries up ditches or breaks down bridges.

September begins on the same day of the week as December, but no other month.

The autumn equinox is on 22 September this year at 6.20 pm GMT. This is when there is almost equal amounts of daylight and dark at all latitudes.

September events include:

- On 1 September 1939, Germany under Hitler invaded Poland, starting the second world war
- The great fire of London started in Pudding Lane on 2 September 1666
- 8 September 1944 the first V2 flying bombs kill 3 people in London
- Harry Jackson became the first person to be convicted based on fingerprint evidence 13 September 1902
- The US Constitution was adopted on 17 September 1787
- On 19 September 1356, The Black Prince, eldest son of Edward III, led the English to victory over the French at the Battle of Poitiers
- Britain's first Prime Minister, Sir Robert Walpole moved in to 10 Downing Street on 22 September 1735
- The first transfusion of human blood was performed at Guy's Hospital, London on 25 September 1818
- On 28 September 1745, 'God Save the King' was sung for the first time at London's Drury Lane Theatre
- After meeting Hitler in Munich, British Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain said, 'I believe it is peace for our time' on 30 September 1939.
